

Brig. Gen. David P. Glaser supervises, directs, trains, and synchronizes the primary and special staff of over 1,800 Soldiers, DA Civilians, and contractors executing Title 10 support and theater security cooperation to U.S. and coalition land forces in the Central Command area of responsibility. He integrates staff efforts of main and forward command posts, as well as provides oversight and fiscal discipline for a budget of over \$28 billion. Glaser is responsible for continuous coordination between USARCENT Staff and elements in Kuwait, Qatar, Iraq, Afghanistan, Fort Bragg, Shaw AFB, HQDA, USCENCOM, and over 45,000 Soldiers,

Civilians, and contractors in subordinate commands. He also provides oversight of the Special Troops Battalion and 132nd Engineer Detachment.

Glaser was commissioned as a second lieutenant in 1985 through the Reserve Officer Training Corps at Xavier University in Cincinnati, Ohio. He has held key staff positions with joint and operational assignments, specifically Operation Enduring Freedom (Afghanistan) and Operation Iraqi Freedom (Iraq). Glaser's prior assignments include serving as the Deputy Director of Ministry of Interior Advisory Group, Combined Security Transition Command - Afghanistan, International Security Assistance Force during Operation Enduring Freedom; Deputy Provost Marshal General for Office of the Provost Marshal General of the Army in Washington, DC; Military Fellow, Strategic Studies Group, for the Office of the Chief of Staff of the Army in Washington, DC; Senior Service College Fellow at the Center for a New American Security in Washington, DC; Commander of the 42nd Military Police Brigade, I Corps at Joint Base Lewis McChord, Washington; Deputy Operations Officer, G-3, I Corps at Fort Lewis, Washington; Chief of the Military Police Branch at United States Army Human Resources Command in Alexandria, Virginia; Commander of the 519th Military Police Battalion at the Joint Readiness Training Center at Fort Polk, Louisiana; Chief of the Antiterrorism Branch for the Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff, Operations and Plans in Washington, DC; Executive Officer for 25th Military Police Battalion, later Executive Officer United States Army Military Police Brigade-Hawaii for the 25th Infantry Division (Light) in Schofield Barracks, Hawaii; Plans and Program Analyst, Executive Officer, and Budget Analyst for the Deputy Chief of Staff for Resource

Glaser earned his BBA in Finance from Xavier University, and MA in Comptrollership from Syracuse University. His military education includes the Military Police Officer Basic and Advanced Courses, United States Army Command and General Staff College, Senior Service College Fellowship - Center for New American Security, and the Joint and Combined War-fighting School.

Glaser's awards and decorations include the Legion of Merit (with Oak Leaf Cluster), Bronze Star Medal (with Oak Leaf Cluster), Meritorious Service Medal (with 5 Oak Leaf Clusters), Army Commendation Medal (with 4 Oak Leaf Clusters), Army Achievement Medal (with Oak Leaf Cluster), Combat Action Badge, Parachutist Badge, Air Assault Badge, and Army Staff Identification Badge.
