COL Toni K. Sabo arrived at Area Support Group-Jordan having just completed her United States Army War College Fellowship with Columbia University Teachers College where she studied in the Social-Organizational Psychology program in the Department of Organization & Leadership.

Prior to her fellowship, she served from 2018-2020 as the Military Intelligence (MI) Branch Chief at Human Resources Command (HRC), Fort Knox, KY, providing full spectrum career and talent management support to more than 6,500 MI officers in worldwide assignments.

During her field grade years, COL Sabo taught composition and literature at the Department of English & Philosophy at the United States Military Academy at West Point; this assignment prepared her for follow-on assignments focused on strategic level writing. In 2010 she served on the advisory group for the Commander of United States Central Command then for the International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) commander in Afghanistan. Upon redeployment, she worked as Chief of Production in the Joint Intelligence Center at Central Command.
